Shop lifting is becoming a concern.

We did:

Local officers have been working with the business crime initiative and a number of people have been given exclusion notices, to stay out of certain areas or shops. Some officers have been working in plain clothes around the shops and arrests have been made by these officers most days. Staff members in the shops are being educated by officers in the latest methods used by shop lifters.



Bogus caller warning

Staffordshire Police is warning local residents to be on their guard against bogus callers following recent incidents in the area.

There are a number of things you can do to protect yourself and your home:

- check the identity of anyone calling at your door,
- phone the company they are claiming to be calling on behalf of, using the number in the telephone book, not one the caller provides you with
- don't keep large amounts of cash at home. It really is much safer in the bank
- keep doors locked – even when you are at home
- if you have a door chain, use this every time you answer the door
- if unsure about callers, do not let them into your home.
