We did:

Officers are now working with the council's new Anti-social Behaviour Co-ordinator for the area, Deborah Johnston. A current problem location is being worked on with local officers, Deborah and Councillor Platt. To date, some of the residents from the address concerned have been evicted by the property managers and in one case by the court. Two other residents from the address have been issued with ASB warning letters, which if ignored could lead to ASBO's.

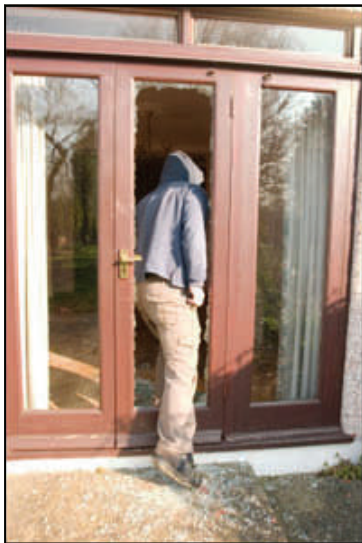


You said:

There has been an increase in this type of crime in previous years, outside our area. To keep our area free of burglaries, residents must be on their guard at all times and ensure that home security is adhered to.



Thief's Christmas shop window?

Police are urging people to keep themselves and their property safe this festive period. Take simple crime prevention measures to avoid presenting opportunist thieves with free gifts and other valuable items:

- at home keep valuables and presents away from windows
- take cardboard/wrappings of large items to the tip to avoid advertising you have a new TV, bike or other new products
- keep your vehicles and homes locked at all times and keep keys away from windows and doors
- ensure all doors and windows are locked
- report any suspicious activity or people to the police immediately.
