Damage is being caused in the Amington rec by youths.

We did:

We visited local schools and spoke to staff and pupils to try to identify possible offenders.

Local and response officers, and street wardens have carried out high visibility patrols and updated residents.

Information has now been received about possible offenders which we are following up.

Lead thefts are on the increase in the Kerria area.

We did:

We increased patrols and liaised with the council to look at the possibility of using other materials instead of lead.

We conducted extensive house-to-house enquiries and gave crime prevention advice.

Two males have been arrested and charged with attempting to steal lead off a roof in the Amington area in July.

You said:

Youths drinking at the Kerria Centre is a concern.

We did:

We confiscated alcohol from youths under 18 who were found drinking. We made their parents aware and also passed details to our anti-social behaviour officer.

People over the age of 18 who are under the influence of alcohol and causing anti-social behaviour will be dispersed from the area.
