Request - You asked us the following:

This is an informal request to find information about the Aliens Department from a historical perspective and not to cause any drama with any media. It is for a group of over 50's to indicate that I had to register on arrival in the UK within 7 days at the local Aliens department in 1985. It happened to be Stafford police department. I still have my green document, stamped across my photograph as I was told to always keep it. It still amuses me.

I told my doctor today that I was an alien and produced my card an hour later. Just for fun. Could you provide more information with regards to the abolishment or closure of this unit . Again just to reiterate this is only to provide historical information to a group of over fifties with regards to changes over time as to how foreigners are labelled in the UK. It is not to cause trouble for anyone individual or government. Purely historical facts. No crime has been committed .

We received your request on 07/04/2025 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

Staffordshire Police's response to your enquiry is as follows:

Staffordshire Police does not hold the requested information.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Staffordshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Central Disclosure Unit within two months of the Force's response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Central Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within 20 working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
