Request - You asked us the following:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request the following information for your entire police force area:

1. Theft from Motor Vehicle - Wheels/Tyres Please provide the total number of recorded offences of “theft from a motor vehicle” where wheels and/or tyres were stolen, for each of the last five years (2020–2024).

For this request, “wheels/tyres stolen” refers to any recorded offence where at least one wheel, tyre, or alloy was stolen from a vehicle.

Please provide data by calendar year (Jan–Dec) if available, or by financial year (Apr–Mar) if this is how your data is recorded, and state which has been used.

If “wheels/tyres” are not recorded as a distinct category, please identify relevant offences using Home Office offence codes or keyword searches in the offence description (whichever is easier) and state the codes/keywords used.

If no breakdown for wheels/tyres is available, please provide figures for the nearest available category (e.g., all “vehicle parts stolen”) and state the category used.

2. Monthly Breakdown

If available without exceeding cost/time limits, please also provide the above figures broken down by month for each year.

If monthly figures are not available or would exceed cost limits, please provide annual totals instead.

3. Offence Coding

Please include any relevant Home Office offence codes or internal category descriptions used in the extraction if possible.

4. Output Format

Please provide the data in a spreadsheet format (e.g. CSV or XLSX).

If any part of this request is unclear, or if fulfilling it in its current form would exceed cost limits, please let me know how it could be refined.

We received your request on 11/08/2025 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

Staffordshire Police’s response to your enquiry is as follows:

In accordance with Section 17(1) of the Freedom of Information Act, this letter represents a refusal notice for this particular request.

The following exemption has been applied:

- Section 12(1) where the cost of compliance exceeds the appropriate limit. Section 12(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the prescribed limit'.

The above information has been withheld for the following reasons:

There is no method by which we can readily retrieve information from our systems to answer this request. For the time period requested, there have been in excess of 10,320 occurrences where the offence has been recorded as theft from a motor vehicle. In order to ascertain whether the items stolen included a tyre or wheel, the record for each offence would require manual review. To extract this data would therefore require a very labour-intensive manual trawl through each record.

From dip sampling, it has been estimated that it would take approximately 4 minutes to review each record to answer this request, this would equate to over 688 hours. To achieve this task would therefore exceed the 18-hour time and cost threshold of the FOI Act by some considerable margin.

Advice and assistance

Section 16 of the Act places an obligation upon the Authority to provide advice and assistance, in order to comply with this obligation please see below.

In order to assist in refining your request. Data could be provided for the offence of 'theft from a motor vehicle' and where a free text search is completed for 'wheel' or 'tyre' and the Home office category is 'vehicles offences' from 2020, broken down by month and year. However, please note further exemptions may apply.

Please be advised that all Freedom of Information request responses are published on the Staffordshire Police website although personal details are not included.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Staffordshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Central Disclosure Unit within two months of the Force's response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Central Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within 20 working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
