Request - You asked us the following:

Original Request:

A local councillor made a statement in a local newspaper, can you provide me with the statistics I requested please
as the reply from the council said to approach you and I want to see how factual Jonathan Price's comments were in the Staffs newsletter.

An article was published about the Redhill Island update in which you made a statement.

Under the freedom of information act can you provide the following:

Provide the statistics about how many drivers have been caught speeding and how many prosecutions for dangerous driving have happened along the A34 Stone rd carriageway in the last 3 years please?
You claim to have listened to residents, so I'm assuming you will also have researched it all, so the speed limit can drop from 40mph to 30.

Clarification received 10/10/2024 regarding the 3 year time period:

Please look from the date of request please.

Further clarification received 11/10/2024 regarding which prosecutions the applicant is requesting (speeding or dangerous driving):

I am looking for both.

I didn't know there are different dangerous driving offences, so just a whole number for the different ones you have on file for the road section mentioned.

Refined request:

Thank you for your reply, I think you have sent me the information from Stone all the way along the A34. I was looking for the stats which cover from the island (by the new housing estate) which is just outside of the town coming along the dual carriageway into the town centre. I hope that you know where I mean, but I am quite happy to chat on the phone if you wish further clarification.

We received your request on 27/12/2024 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

Staffordshire Police's response to your enquiry is as follows:

Staffordshire Police holds the requested information.

- I was looking for the stats which cover from the island (by the new housing estate) which is just outside of the town coming along the dual carriageway into the town centre. – **Disclosed, please**

Please note that the information provided has been retrieved from a search of our traffic offence recording system for all speeding offences in 2022, 2023 and 2024, with the location recorded as 'A34 Stone Road Stafford Redhill'.

Please note that this data has been provided to the best of our ability, subject to the limitation of current recording protocols and systems/software. Additional offences/incidents may have been recorded during these timescales but are awaiting finalisation and input onto these systems and would not be present within this dataset.

Every effort is made to ensure that the data presented is accurate and complete. However, it is important to note that this has been extracted from multiple sources, developed for specific policing purposes, for which data extraction methods have not been specifically designed to directly correlate with the terminology of this request. Therefore, the data presented is subject to the inaccuracies and idiosyncrasies inherent in any large-scale recording system.

As a consequence, care should be taken in the interpretation and presentation of this data, so as to not misrepresent the whole or any part of the data disclosed.

Please be advised that all Freedom of Information request responses are published on the Staffordshire Police website although personal details are not included.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Staffordshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

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The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Central Disclosure Unit within two months of the Force's response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Central Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within 20 working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Decision maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
