**Request - You asked us the following:**

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information.

I am requesting a breakdown of the total number of reported aggravated burglaries/robberies of vehicles in your Police Force area.

We would like to know the car thefts that were 'aggravated' burglaries/robberies reported to your police force during the past 12 months from 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025, and the same period for 2023-2024 and 2022-2023.

We would also like to know the total number of stolen vehicles in your Police Force area in the same periods.

Can you provide me with:

1. A breakdown of the total number of reported stolen vehicles that were 'aggravated' burglaries/robberies. Could you please provide a breakdown for the past three years, including the past 12 months, from 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025. And the same months for 2023-2024 and 2022-2023. Please include the vehicle type: manufacturer / model name.

- a. 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025
- b. 1st April 2023 to 31st March 2024
- c. 1st April 2022 to 31st March 2023

We received your request on 02/05/2025 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

Staffordshire Police's response to your enquiry is as follows:

**Staffordshire Police holds the requested information.**

- I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information.
- I am requesting a breakdown of the total number of reported aggravated burglaries/robberies of vehicles in your Police Force area.

  - Can you provide me with:
    - 1. A breakdown of the total number of reported stolen vehicles that were ‘aggravated’ burglaries/robberies. Could you please provide a breakdown for the past three years, including the past 12 months, from 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025. And the same months for 2023-2024 and 2022-2023. Please include the vehicle type: manufacturer / model name. – **Disclosed, please see the accompanying file titled ‘FOI 21296 Vehicle Theft Data’.**
    - a. 1st April 2024 to 31st March 2025
    - b. 1st April 2023 to 31st March 2024
    - c. 1st April 2022 to 31st March 2023

Please be advised that the data has been provided for all aggravated vehicle taking offences and all theft of a vehicle offences in the time period requested along with the make and model of the vehicle where it has been recorded. The vehicle make is in bold with the total number next to it, the vehicle models are broken down underneath each make.

Please note that this data has been provided to the best of our ability, subject to the limitation of current recording protocols and systems/software. Additional offences may have been recorded during these timescales but are awaiting finalisation and input onto these systems and would not be present within this dataset.

Every effort is made to ensure that the data presented is accurate and complete. However, it is important to note that this has been extracted from multiple sources, developed for specific policing purposes, for which data extraction methods have not been specifically designed to directly correlate with the terminology of this request. Therefore, the data presented is subject to the inaccuracies and idiosyncrasies inherent in any large-scale recording system.

As a consequence, care should be taken in the interpretation and presentation of this data, so as to not misrepresent the whole or any part of the data disclosed.

Please be advised that all Freedom of Information request responses are published on the Staffordshire Police website although personal details are not included.

### **Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure**

#### **1. Who Can Ask for a Review**

Any person who has requested information from Staffordshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

#### **2. How to Request a Review**

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Central Disclosure Unit within two months of the Force's response to the original FOI request.

### **3. Review Procedure**

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by another Decision Maker who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Central Disclosure Unit will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within 20 working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The independent Decision Maker will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

### **4. Conclusion of the Appeal**

On completion of the review the Independent Decision maker will reply to the complainant with the result of the review. If the complainant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
