We received your request on 17/10/2025 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

Staffordshire Police's response to your enquiry is as follows:

Staffordshire Police (SP) holds the requested information.

Request 1.

The total number of motorists of all categories that were arrested by the police force between December 1, 2024 and January 5, 2025, after failing an alcohol breathalyser test. – **Disclosed, please see below:**

If possible, please break down by time of day when the motorist was stopped by police and asked to take the test.

12 pm-6 am – **Disclosed, 123.**

6.01 am-11.59 am – **Disclosed, 16.**

Total stopped – **Disclosed, 139.**

Request 2.

The number of failed breathalyser tests in the following ranges (as measured in mg of alcohol per 100 millilitres of breath)

Between 35 mg and 70 mg – **Disclosed, 58.**

Between 70 mg and 105 mg – **Disclosed, 32.**

Between 105 mg and 140 mg – **Disclosed, 18.**

Above 140 mg – **Disclosed, 3.**

Please be advised there are 28 arrests which have either been recorded as 'failed to provide' or not recorded.

Request 3.

The total number of motorists of all categories that were arrested by the police force between December 1, 2024 and January 5, 2025, on suspicion of drug driving. – **Disclosed, please see below:**

If possible, please break down by time of day.

12 pm-6 am – **Disclosed, 70.**

6.01 am-11.59 am – **Disclosed, 19.**

Total stopped – **Disclosed, 89.**

Request 4.

The number of motorists who were stopped by the police force between December 1, 2024 and January 5, 2025, who were subsequently charged with - **Disclosed, please see below:**

- A drink-driving offence - **Disclosed, 111.**
- A drug driving offence - **Disclosed, 59.**
- A combination of drink and drug driving offences - **Disclosed, 1.**

Please note that this data has been provided to the best of the ability of SP, subject to the limitation of current recording protocols and systems/software. Additional offences/incidents may have been recorded during these timescales but are awaiting finalisation and input onto these systems and would not be present within this dataset.

Every effort is made to ensure that the data presented is accurate and complete. However, it is important to note that this has been extracted from multiple sources, developed for specific policing purposes, for which data extraction methods have not been specifically designed to directly correlate with the terminology of this request. Therefore, the data presented is subject to the inaccuracies and idiosyncrasies inherent in any large-scale recording system.

Consequently, care should be taken in the interpretation and presentation of this data, to not misrepresent the whole or any part of the data disclosed.

Please be advised that all Freedom of Information request responses are published on the SP website although personal details are not included.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from SP, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Information Access Team within two months of the SP response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by a supervisor who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Information Access Team will set a

target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to forty working days.

The independent supervisor will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, considering the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the independent supervisor will reply to the appellant with the result of the review. If the appellant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
