Request - You asked us the following:

Please provide the following details for all submissions from January 1st 2022 until the most recent submissions made under Operation Snap (that is, all footage of suspected driving offences uploaded by members of the public) to Staffordshire Police.

- * Offence description
- * Offence date
- * Reason for No Further Action
- * Disposal

This should be provided in the form of an excel spreadsheet. The Metropolitan Police routinely publish this information, which you can use as a guide, and is found here:

We received your request on 24/10/2025 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

Staffordshire Police's response to your enquiry is as follows:

Staffordshire Police does not hold the requested information.

Advice and assistance

Section 16 of the Act places an obligation upon the Authority to provide advice and assistance, to comply with this obligation please see below.

Although Staffordshire Police do accept reports of transport related incidents that have been captured on dash cam or cycle cams (these reports are typically made via the Staffordshire Police website), they are not easily identifiable on any of our systems. No data is captured on any of these systems to denote that Dashcam is a factor. From August 2025 to November 2025 alone there have been 1264 transport related incidents. These would have to be manually checked which would result in a Section 12 response for exceeding the 18-hour time and cost threshold.

Please be advised that all Freedom of Information request responses are published on the Staffordshire Police website although personal details are not included.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Staffordshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Information Access Team within two months of the Force's response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by a supervisor who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Information Access Team will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within 20 working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The independent Supervisor will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, considering the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Supervisor will reply to the appellant with the result of the review. If the appellant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
