Request - You asked us the following:

I am requesting the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

-Please provide a monthly breakdown into the number of victims who have reported having an intimate or explicit images/videos/deep fakes shared of them on the internet without their permission from the period 1st of January 2020 to 26th of October 2025.

-Please provide a monthly breakdown on the victims' ages, gender, location, and nationality who reported having intimate or explicit images/videos/deep fake shared of them online without permission from the period above.

- Please provide a monthly breakdown of the ages, gender, location, and nationality of the perpetrators from the period stated above.

-Please provide a monthly breakdown of the number of perpetrators who were warned, arrested, fined, charged, or had no further action taken in relation to sharing an intimate or explicit images/videos/deep fakes without permission from the period above.

-And I ask anything within the spirit of the request be included in the response.

I also request the following information be presented in a document that can be copy and pasted from, and can allow for keywords to be searched in the document.

Please report information such as dates and ages in the format Police collect it.

We received your request on 27/10/2025 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

Staffordshire Police's response to your enquiry is as follows:

In accordance with Section 17(1) of the Freedom of Information Act, this letter represents a refusal notice for this particular request.

The following exemption has been applied:

- Section 12(1) where the cost of compliance exceeds the appropriate limit.
Section 12(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the prescribed limit'.

The above information has been withheld for the following reasons:

There is no method by which we can readily retrieve information from our systems to answer this request.. Prior to the introduction of the Online Safety Act 2023, there was no specific offence relating to 'intimate

or explicit images/videos/deep fakes shared on the internet without permission'. Therefore, prior to this date, in order to attempt to provide the data requested, all offences recorded under the Malicious Communications Act, the Criminal Justice Act 1988, and the Protection from Harassment Act would need to be reviewed.

From 1st January 2020 to 31st December 2023, there have been in excess of 23,220 such occurrences, of which each offence would require manual review. To extract this data would therefore require a very labour-intensive manual trawl through each record.

From dip sampling, it has been estimated that it would take approximately 4 minutes to review each record to answer this request, this would equate to over 1,548 hours. To achieve this task would therefore exceed the 18-hour time and cost threshold of the FOI Act by some considerable margin.

Advice and assistance

Section 16 of the Act places an obligation upon the Authority to provide advice and assistance, in order to comply with this obligation please see below.

If you were to refine your request, data could be provided for the offence, Section 66B of the Sexual Offences Act and the Online Safety Act 2023 from 01/01/2024 to 30/10/2025, broken down by year. Furthermore this data could be broken down by the age and gender of both suspects/offenders and victims, and location by Local Policing Team. Furthermore, outcome for each offence could be provided; however, please note further substantive exemptions may apply.

Please be advised that all Freedom of Information request responses are published on the Staffordshire Police website although personal details are not included.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from Staffordshire Police, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Information Access Team within two months of the Force's response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by a Supervisor who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Information Access Team will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within 20 working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The independent Supervisor will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, taking into account the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Supervisor will reply to the appellant with the result of the review. If the appellant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
