Community Protection Warning (Pursuant to s43 of the ASB Crime and Policing Act 2014)

TAKE NOTICE, that [REDACTED] being an Officer authorised by Staffordshire Police under the provisions of section 43 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, am satisfied that on previous occasions the conduct of the Albrighton and Woodland Hunt has had a detrimental impact on the quality of life of those living in the South Staffordshire area.

To ensure there is no damage to property or harassment alarm and distress to residents and landowners within the South Staffordshire area, please see advice below to be adhere to when organising events over the forthcoming year.

Online report to be submitted to Staffordshire Police 72 hours prior to formal hunt meetings (Ensure you tick the "events" box on the online form before submitting) providing a calendar of all events (including formal hunt meetings, cubbing events, hound training events, social events, etc.) for the forthcoming hunt season with:

- times, dates, locations,
- overview of activity,
- contact details, name and contact details of the Master of the Hounds
- landowners' details who have provided permission for the hunt to cross their property,
- the amount of persons expected to be in attendance.
- any other relevant information relating to the meeting **including a detailed map of the trail.**

Ensure you tick the "events" box on the online form before submitting



Scent Trail and routes

- Confirmation is required that the trail is the same as the details map provided. Confirmation is required that they have been laid in areas where it will not lead hounds out of permissible land, for example residential, and business properties.

Hounds –

On the day of the hunt meeting the Master of the Hounds must be ready to make themselves available upon request to Police Officers / PCSO's.





This warning letter should be considered as formal notification of your need to put these problems right to avoid further consequences. Please ensure that you take the actions outlined in this Community Protection Warning within the timescales detailed:

These actions are advised but you should note that nuisance occurs, continues or persists, despite this warning, you may be served with a community protection notice. This notice will tell you the things that you must do to put these problems right – if you fail to do so without reasonable excuse:

- (i) You may be prosecuted. If you are prosecuted and convicted the maximum penalty is a fine not exceeding level 4 on the standard scale (currently £2,500);
- (ii) The court may make whatever order the court thinks appropriate for ensuring that what the notice requires to be done is done.
- (iii) An order under this section may in particular require you:
 - (a) to carry out specified work, or
 - (b) to allow specified work to be carried out by or on behalf of a specified local authority.
- (iv) The court may require you to surrender possession of any item used in your failure to comply with the Notice, to a constable or to a person representing the local authority. The court may require this item to be destroyed or disposed of by the police force. A justice of the peace may issue a warrant, authorising a constable or authorised person to enter your premises to seize the item.

We will also consider what other action may be required to stop the problems which may include criminal action, if a criminal offence has been committed.
