Request - You asked Staffordshire Police (SP) the following:

I am writing to request information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

I am seeking updated figures relating to registered sex offenders, following data previously obtained by BBC news via FOI requests that were reported on in March 2023 (<https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-64624921>).

I would like to request the most recent available data between 2021 to present on:

The number of registered sex offenders recorded as:

- Missing, or
- Wanted for arrest

The number of registered sex offenders who have:

- Notified police of a name change or alias

The number of offences relating to:

- Breaches of notification requirements

If possible, please provide:

- Annual figures broken down by year
- Data in the same format/categories as previously supplied in response to FOI requests used in the BBC report

SP received your request on 23/03/2026 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

SP's response to your enquiry is as follows:

In accordance with Section 17(1) of the Freedom of Information Act, this letter represents a refusal notice for this request.

The following exemption has been applied:

- Section 12(1) where the cost of compliance exceeds the appropriate limit.

Section 12(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the prescribed limit'.

The above information has been withheld for the following reasons:

There is no method by which SP can readily retrieve information from our systems to answer part of this request. For the time period requested, there have been in excess of 199 nominals, in order to ascertain whether there was a name change, the record for each nominal would need to be reviewed. From dip sampling, it has been estimated that it would take approximately 6 minutes to review each record.

Furthermore, to determine if the offence related to a breach, the record of each offence would need to be reviewed. For this year alone there has been 145 occurrences. To extract this data would therefore require a very labour-intensive manual trawl through each record. From dip sampling, it has been estimated that it would take at least 8 minutes to review each record to answer this part of the request, for this year alone.

Therefore, to service this request, this would equate to over 38 hours. To achieve this task would therefore exceed the 18-hour time and cost threshold of the FOI Act.

Advice and assistance

Section 16 of the Act places an obligation upon the Authority to provide advice and assistance, to comply with this obligation please see below.

In order to assist in refining your request, data could be provided for the nominals who are wanted or missing as of 01/04/2026.

Please be advised that all Freedom of Information request responses are published on the SP website although personal details are not included.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from SP, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Information Access Team within two months of the Force's response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by a supervisor who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Information Access Team will set a

target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within 20 working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to 40 working days.

The independent Supervisor will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, considering the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the Independent Supervisor will reply to the appellant with the result of the review. If the appellant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
