Imminent (January)

Burglary Residential: Previous crime patterns during January 2023 and 2024 saw two emerging series. More recently during 2024 there was an increase in break ins at rural properties (mostly backing on to fields) in East Staffordshire, Burton upon Trent, Tutbury and Rolleston. Within 2023 there was a rise in jewellery breaks at high value properties in Little Aston and Sutton Coldfield. In addition to these two patterns rural farm houses and outbuildings have been previously targeted in Stafford, Newcastle and South Staffordshire for tools, quadbikes, 4x4 vehicles and agricultural / construction plant machinery.

Theft of Motor Vehicle: For the past two years January has seen a consistent series of offending Forcewide and is likely to continue alongside [REDACTED] within the city.

Other Offences: Increase expected during January with the crime area with the largest volume being Possession and Distribution of Indecent Images with Cannock Chase LPT having the largest volume.

Personal Robbery: Whilst this area has not been highlighted as a potential exception January was a peak during 2020 and 2024. Tamworth LPT had the largest volume with a previous series of a group targeting individuals in the centre.

Rape: Whilst this area has not been highlighted as a potential exception January and February was a peak during 2023 and 2024. The area with the largest volume was Rape of a Female 16+ with Stafford LPT having the most incidents. There are no repeat NBHs / RIAs or victims / suspects during this time period.

TFMV: Another crime pattern to be aware of is the increase in tool thefts from vans which was particularly seen in Cannock Chase during January 2024.

Burglary Business: Increase expected during March which is a consistent pattern during previous years. During this period the LPT with the highest volume was Staffordshire Moorlands with [REDACTED] (Cheadle West) being a repeat RIA but no repeat addresses within that area.

During this period the area with the highest volume was Assault ABH with the LPT with the highest volume being East Staffordshire. Other Serious Sexual Offences: Whilst this area has not been highlighted as a potential exception March was a peak during 2022 and 2023.

Other Offences: Increase expected during March which is a consistent pattern during previous years. During this period the area with the highest volume was Sexual Assault on a Female 13+. The LPTs with the largest volume were Newcastle and Staffordshire Moorlands - neither having a repeat RIA or address.

Other Violence: Whilst this area has not been highlighted as a potential exception March was a peak during 2022 and 2023. During this period the area with the highest volume was Common Assault and Battery with Stafford being the LPT with the largest volume. The top repeat RIA being [REDACTED] (Forebridge) with two repeat address in that area being [REDACTED] on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on [REDACTED].

TOMV: Whilst this area has not been highlighted as a potential exception March was a peak during 2023 and 2024. During this period the LPT with the highest volume was Lichfield with [REDACTED] (Little Aston) being the top repeat RIA with no repeat addresses within that area.
