Request - You asked Staffordshire Police (SP) the following:

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, please provide the following information regarding gender-neutral, unisex, all-gender, or mixed-sex toilet facilities across your force's operational estate:

Total Spend: The total financial spend (including refurbishment, construction, and signage costs) incurred over the last 24 months (or 2024/25, 2025/26, and 2026/27 to date) on creating, converting, or building gender-neutral, unisex, or all-gender toilet facilities.

Total Toilet Number: The total number of gender-neutral toilets opened/converted for the same timeframe.

Single-Sex Conversions: The total number of traditional single-sex male or female toilet blocks that were permanently converted or removed, for the same timeframe.

Station Breakdown: A breakdown of the spending and facility count by individual police station, HQ, or operational site name, but only if the cost limit has not already been reached by the previous two questions.

SP received your request on 11/08/2026 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

SP's response to your enquiry is as follows:

SP holds some of the requested information.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, please provide the following information regarding gender-neutral, unisex, all-gender, or mixed-sex toilet facilities across your force's operational estate:

- **Total Spend:** The total financial spend (including refurbishment, construction, and signage costs) incurred over the last 24 months (or 2024/25, 2025/26, and 2026/27 to date) on creating, converting, or building gender-neutral, unisex, or all-gender toilet facilities.
- **No information held. This data is included in the overall construction programme costs and cannot be broken down individually.**
- **Total Toilet Number:** The total number of gender-neutral toilets opened/converted for the same timeframe.
- **Disclosed, 17 in total. Longton Police Station - 9 (6 standard 3 accessible) and 8 at HQ site (6 standard and 2 accessible).**
- **Single-Sex Conversions:** The total number of traditional single-sex male or female toilet blocks that were permanently converted or removed, for the same timeframe.
- **Disclosed, nil.**

- Station Breakdown: A breakdown of the spending and facility count by individual police station, HQ, or operational site name, but only if the cost limit has not already been reached by the previous two questions.
- **Partially disclosed, no information held for the spending breakdown as per the above. There are 41 accessible toilets, 60 female toilets and 55 male toilets across all of SP's sites, these cannot be broken down to individual sites.**

All Freedom of Information request responses are published on the SP website although personal details are not included.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from SP, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.

2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Information Access Team within two months of the SP response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by a supervisor who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Information Access Team will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to forty working days.

The independent supervisor will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, considering the matters raised by the complaint.



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4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the independent supervisor will reply to the appellant with the result of the review. If the appellant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal. The Information Commissioner can be contacted via the following link:
