Request - You asked Staffordshire Police (SP) the following:

I am writing to make a request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 for recorded information held by Staffordshire Police regarding the deployment of mobile speed enforcement vehicles on the A460 Rugeley Road adjacent Hednesford Park.

Site location:- 52.712122, -1.994806

Specifically, I would like to request the following information:

1. Deployment Criteria: The specific criteria, policy documents, or assessment guidelines used by Staffordshire Police (or the Staffordshire Safer Roads Partnership) to justify the placement of a mobile Safety Camera Team vehicle on the A460 Rugeley Road (facing/aiming southbound towards the junction of Victoria Street). The vehicle was parked on a bend & not within line of sight.
2. Site Selection Data: Any recorded site assessment reports, collision history reviews, or speed survey data that led to this specific location being designated as an active mobile speed enforcement site.
3. Collision Statistics: The total number of recorded personal injury collisions (broken down by severity: slight, serious, and fatal) on the A460 Rugeley Road for the specific section of road the Camera Team were located over the last 3 calendar years (2023, 2024, and 2025), plus any available data for 2026.

SP received your request on 01/07/2026 and have processed this under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

SP's response to your enquiry is as follows:

SP holds some of the requested information.

Please note;

- the data has been provided for the location of A460 Rugeley Road on the stretch of road where the mobile safety camera is located.
- that these figures have been provided to the best of the ability of SP, subject to the limitation of current recording protocols and systems/software. Additional incidents may have been recorded during these timescales but are awaiting finalisation and input onto these systems and would not be present within this dataset.

Every effort is made to ensure that the figures presented are accurate and complete. However, it is important to note that data is extracted from multiple sources, developed for specific policing purposes, for which data extraction methods have not been specifically designed to directly correlate with the terminology of this request. Therefore, the data presented is subject to the inaccuracies and idiosyncrasies inherent in any large-scale recording system.

As a consequence, care should be taken in the interpretation and presentation of this data, so as to not misrepresent the whole or any part of the data disclosed.

All Freedom of Information request responses are published on the SP website although personal details are not included.

Freedom of Information Request Appeals Procedure

1. Who Can Ask for a Review

Any person who has requested information from SP, which has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act, is entitled to complain and request an internal review, if they are dissatisfied with the response they received.



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2. How to Request a Review

Requests for review of a Freedom of Information request must be made in writing within two months of the date of receipt of this email, and should be addressed to:

The reference number, date of the request and details of why the review is being requested must be included. Requests for review should be brought to the attention of the Information Access Team within two months of the SP response to the original FOI request.

3. Review Procedure

Receipt of a request for review will be acknowledged in writing. The review will be conducted by a supervisor who is independent from the original Decision Maker. The Information Access Team will set a target date for a response. The response will be made as soon as is practicable with the intention to complete the review within twenty working days. In more complex cases the review may take up to forty working days.

The independent supervisor will conduct a review of the handling of the request for information and of decisions taken, including decisions taken about where the public interest lies in respect of exempt information where applicable. The review enables a re-evaluation of the case, considering the matters raised by the complaint.

4. Conclusion of the Appeal

On completion of the review the independent supervisor will reply to the appellant with the result of the review. If the appellant is still dissatisfied following the review they should contact the Information Commissioner to make an appeal.
