

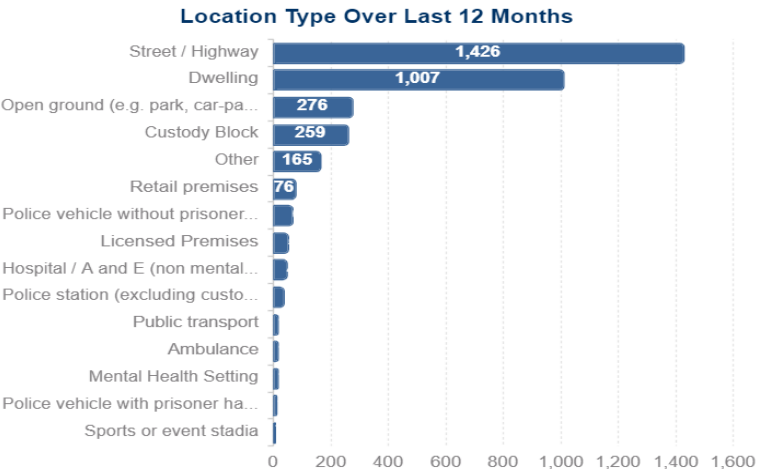
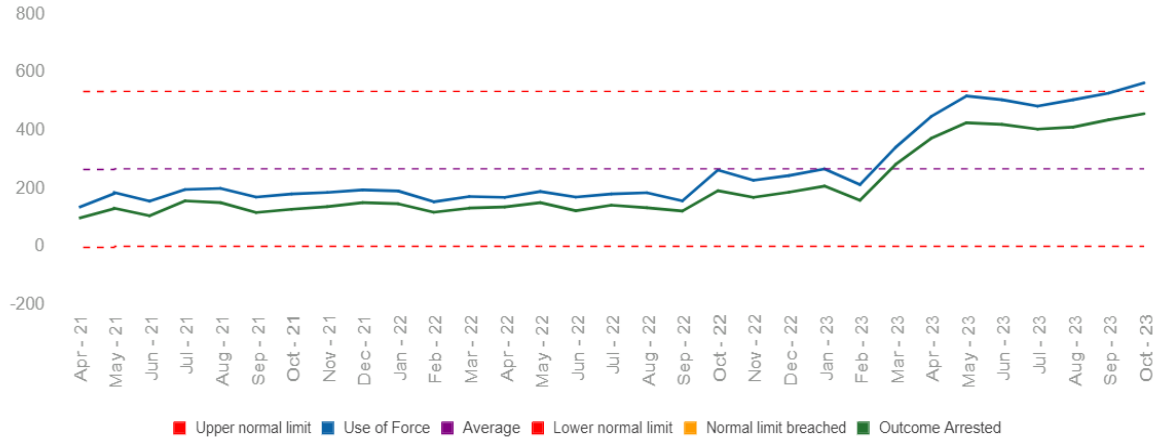

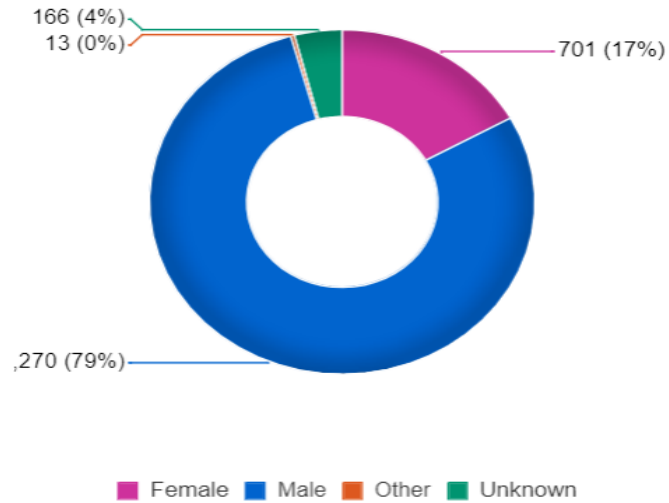


Use of Force Over Time

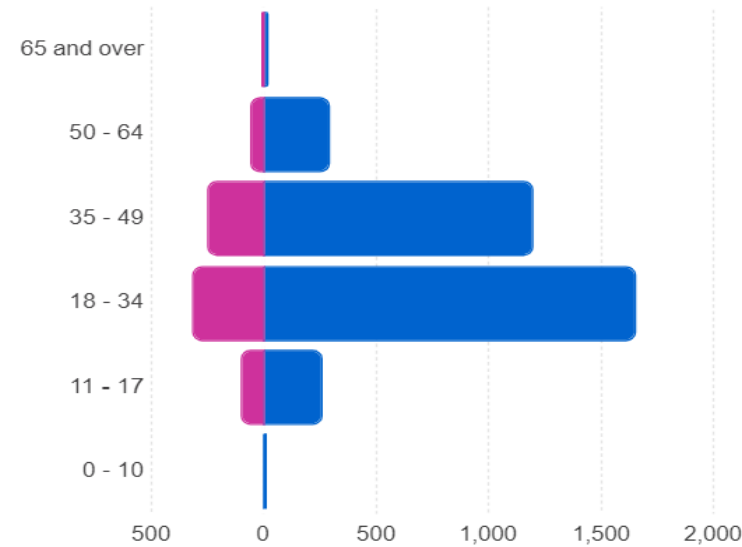


- Staffordshire Police complete a Use of Force (UOF) report per officer for each occasion, the number of UOF reports therefore does not represent the occasions or number of persons where there has been forces used as numerous forms can be submitted for a single occurrence.
- UOF includes where compliant handcuffing is used by police, which is the majority of UOF used.
- In April 2023 the force changed its recording system for UOF reporting and has since seen improved recording of UOF reporting compliance
- 82% of reported UOF results in an arrest

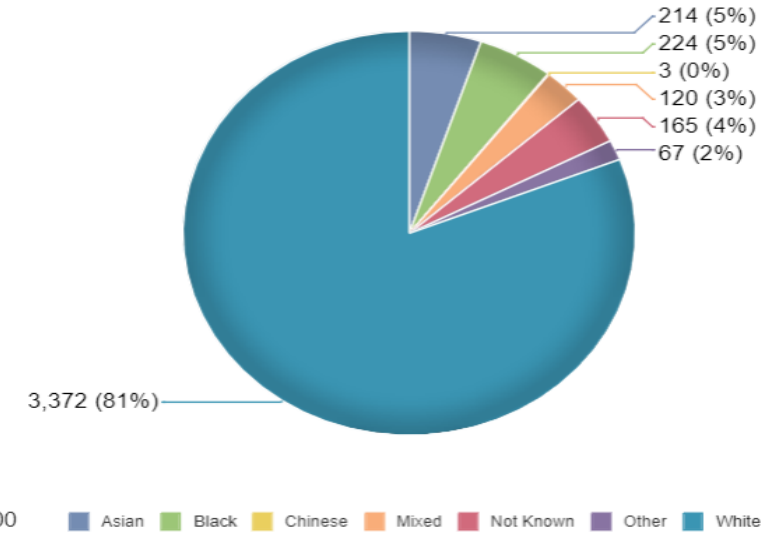
Subject Perceived Gender



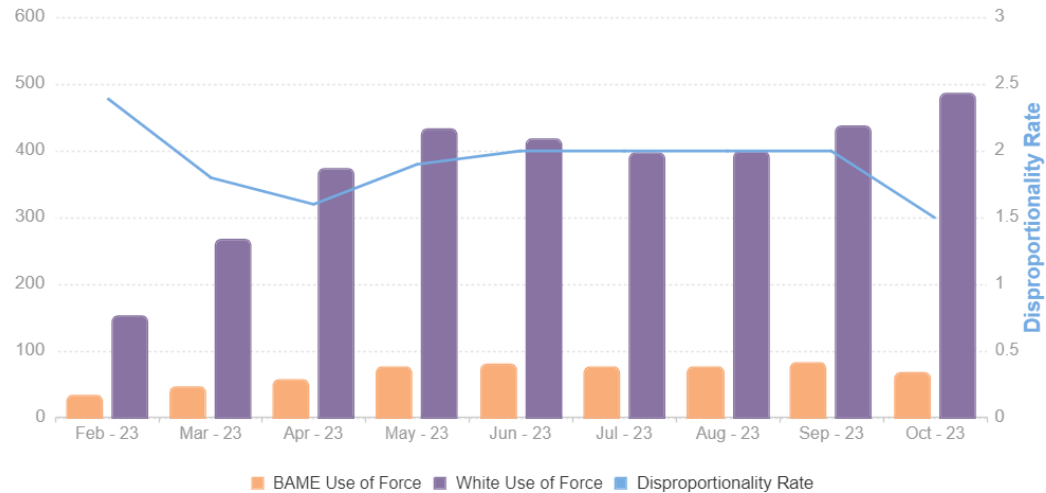
Subject Perceived Age and Gender

Disproportionality Rate Last 12 Months

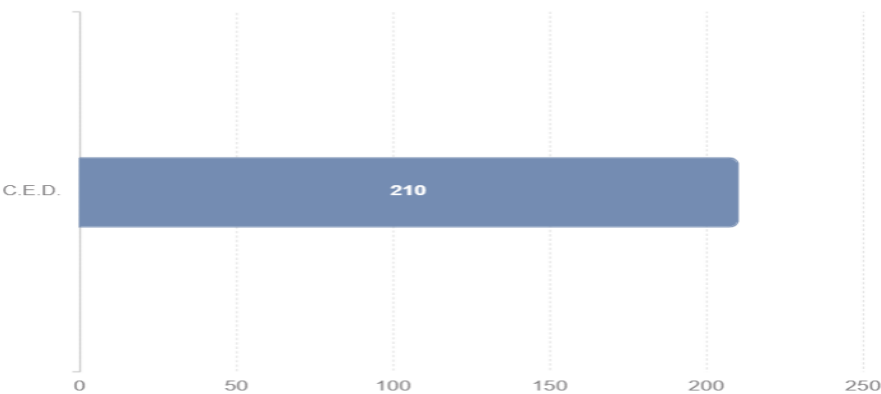

Disproportionality rates are calculated by dividing the BAME use of force per 1000 population by white use of force per 1000 population. So a rate of 1.9 would indicate that persons from BAME groups are nearly twice as likely to have force used against them.

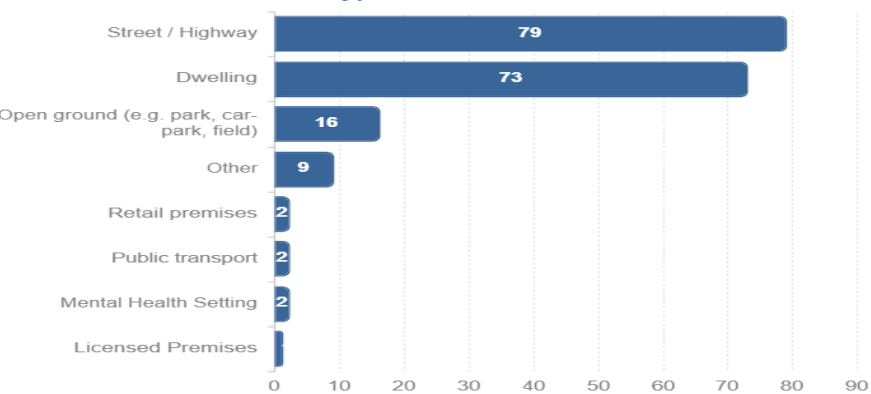
- These figures are impacted by UOF recorded against travelling criminality of people arrested in Staffordshire who are not residents of the county.
- These figures are impacted as multiple forms may be reported against a single person on a single occasion

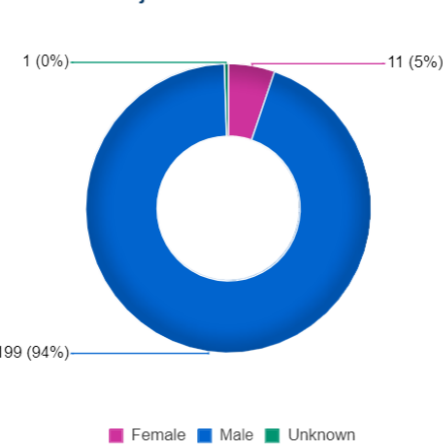
Tactics Used Over Last 12 Months



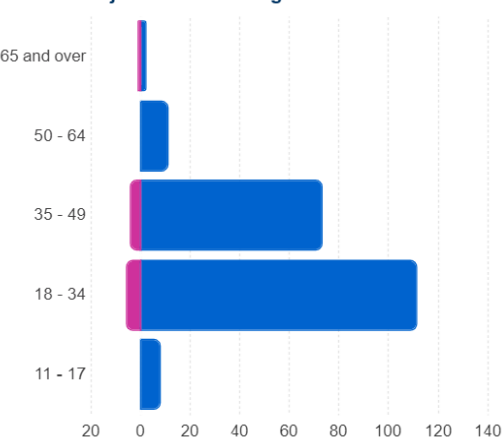
Location Type Over Last 12 Months



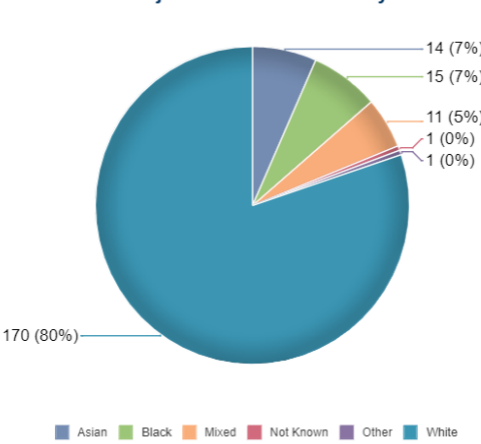
Subject Perceived Gender
