Policy Basis and Implications

2. Legal Basis: The legislation which particularly relates to this Policy is the Human Rights Act 1998 and Common Law duties of a Police Officer to protect life and prevent crime.
3. Management of Police Information (MoPI):
MoPI Policing Purpose: Protecting Life and Property, Preserving order, Preventing the commission of offences, Bringing offenders to justice, Any duty or responsibility arising from common or statute law
MoPI Review, Retention and Disposal addressed as follows:
 This policy will be reviewed annually. All other information collected during the operation of the policy will be classified according to the MoPI category of the offence under investigation e.g. assault, rape and homicide.
4. Associated Benefits: The safeguarding of vulnerable people is the responsibility of all police officers and staff within Staffordshire Police. TecSOS stands for

'TECHNICAL SOS' and is an initiative to provide high risk individuals an enhanced access to the police in an emergency situation. The issue of a TecSOS Personal Safety Device is one of a number of tactical options that should be considered when implementing a safety plan to manage the risk posed to high risk individuals.

6. Financial Implications:	Financial implications will be met through existing funding
